

Application for 2009 Summer High School Internship at The J. David Gladstone Institutes

The J. David Gladstone Institutes offers a unique opportunity for past Gladstone Scholars who participated in the National Student Leadership Conference (NSLC) to intern in a biomedical research laboratory.

Program details:

- 8-week summer internship:
Thursday June 18, 2009–Wednesday August 12, 2009
- Part-time (20 hours per week)
- Work one-on-one with a mentor doing hands-on biomedical research in a laboratory at Gladstone
- Participate in a two-day orientation and regular meetings with fellow interns, mentors, and staff
- Present your research findings at a poster session for mentors, lab members, parents, friends, and teachers at the end of the summer
- Limited to 6 qualified students
- Students will be paid minimum wage (\$9.79) for a maximum of 160 hours and are paid on the 15th and the last day of the month
- Students are responsible for their own transportation to and from Gladstone

Eligibility requirements:

- San Francisco Public High School students who previously received a Gladstone Scholarship to attend the NSLC
- Entering senior year of high school or freshman year of college
- Interested in a career in health, medicine, and/or biomedical research

Application process:

- Complete the attached application form **including parent signature**
- Provide resume
- Answer essay questions (2 pages maximum)
- Return the application by **April 6, 2009 at 5 pm**
- Students will be notified of their acceptance by May 15, 2009
